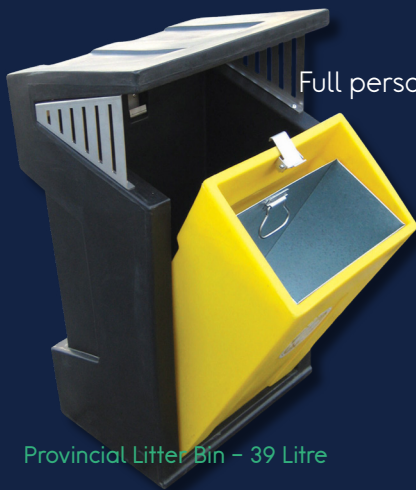

Durham Women continued their pre-season preparations with victory over Liverpool Feders.

Durham's first chance came via skipper Sarah Wilson as she glanced a header narrowly over the bar after Lauren Briggs' corner.

But the Blues wouldn't have to wait long to find the breakthrough, with Briggs again the architect. Her cross-field pass picked out Crosthwaite who took the ball in her stride before firing home from inside the area.

Ella Wilson then netted a second – and her first for Durham – moments later, as she fired home a stunning strike after finding some space 25 yards from goal.

Hannah Blake then saw a goal chalked-out for offside before Liverpool Feders pulled a goal back via a well-taken strike from the edge of the box.

Crosthwaite, though, would restore Durham's two-goal lead after finishing a fine move that had seen Sarah Wilson and Mollie Lambert break at speed.

Feders started the second half strongly and only a fine goal-line clearance from Becky Salikci stopped then reducing the deficit.

But it was Durham who struck next as Ryan-Doyle applied the close range finish after closing down a clearance.

Dee Bradley added a fifth late on after being teed-up by Carly Johns – her strike finding the net via a deflection – before Feders scored their second of the afternoon directly from a corner.

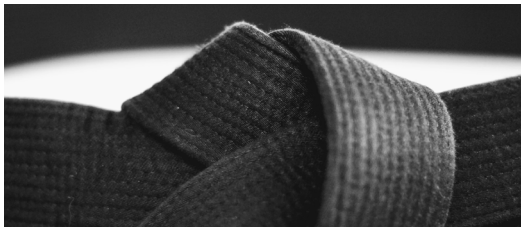

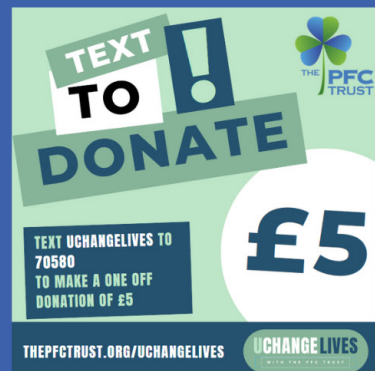

THE BIG INTERVIEW
CARLY JOHNS



We caught up with Carly Johns ahead of her first season in a Durham shirt.

The 21-year-old striker became our third summer signings after joining from Watford, following a goal-laden first season in the Barclays Women's Championship.

Johns netted nine times for the Hornets, with eight of those strikes coming in the league. They included goals in both fixtures against Durham - but now the striker is looking forward to scoring goals in Blue as the club target a successful 2024/25 campaign.

And in a sit-down with *Laura Smith* ahead of the new campaign, she reflected on an intense pre-season with strong opponents and a number of new faces in the squad.

Johns on settling in at the club...

"Yeah, it's been really good and fun.

"The girls have been really encouraging and welcoming.

"I'm really enjoying it and I can't wait for the season to start."

Johns on pre-season...

"It's gone really well.

“We’ve been working on tactics and player relationships on the pitch as well and that’s really been beneficial when we’ve been in the friendly games.

“Obviously we played opposition of high quality, so they’ve been good challenges.

“We’ve been using pre-season to get as fit as possible and hopefully start strong in the season.”

Johns on the home opener...

“I can’t wait to play and get started.

“Even meeting the fans here, I think we’re going to have quite a

lot of them turn up so it’ll be a really exciting game.

“I think, based on last season, Sheffield are a really strong team and we’re expecting nothing less.

“We’re just going to prepare as normal and hopefully get the win.”

Johns on the fans...

“I can’t wait to meet them. I think the atmosphere here is going to be brilliant.

“Hopefully they’ll cheer us on for our first three points.”

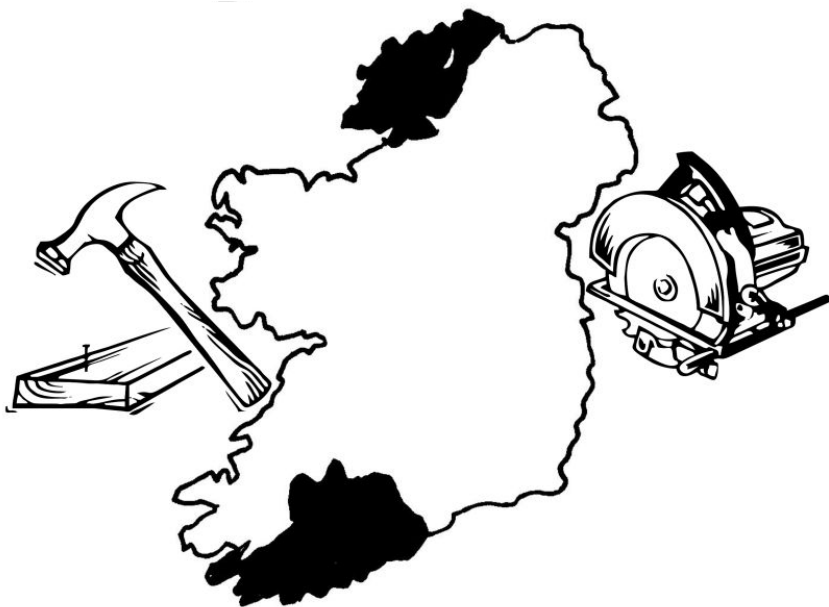
"Women's football in England has witnessed unprecedented growth in recent years,

DURHAM BACK THE INSIDE OUT CAMPAIGN

Mental health charity If U Care Share has launched its annual 'Inside Out' campaign to back World Suicide Prevention Awareness day in September - and Durham Women are showing their support.

Premier League and EFL stars will be showing their support during this month by going 'Inside Out'.

And you'll spot players from Durham Women wearing the 'Inside Out' warm-up tops ahead of today's fixture with Sheffield United.

The 'Inside Out' campaign encourages people to wear their clothes inside out for the day - a symbol to get their feelings out in the open and start conversations which will save lives.

Suicide remains one of the biggest killers of young men across the UK, with six people aged between 40 and 60 dying by suicide every week in the North East alone.

If U Care Share, a mental health and suicide prevention charity based in Chester-le-Street, has designed an 'Inside Out' t-shirt which is available to buy and will be worn by players from the Premier League, Championship, League One, League Two, WSL and numerous non-league teams throughout September.

The North East still has the highest rate of suicide among men under the age of 50. Six men every week take their own lives.

It is estimated that this has a direct impact on 182 people, including members of that person's family, friends, work colleagues, responders and health professionals, etc. In total it means at least. People are affected by suicide in the region every week.

INTRODUCING

SHEFFIELD UNITED

Women's football first came to Sheffield United when club legend Tony Currie founded a female team called Sheffield Hallam United in 1993 as part of the 'United in the Community' project.

More age groups were added to the team as time went on and in 2002 the team was able to enter an open-age league when fellow local side Sheffield Inter folded.

In 2005, United beat Wednesday to reach the County Cup final where they lost to giants Doncaster Rovers Belles, and the next season the club won every single league and cup game to earn promotion to the Midland Combination league.

Over the coming years, United won several more trophies at both first team and junior level and enjoyed stability on and off the pitch as the women's game continued to grow.

The first team gained promotion once again in 2012 as the new Women's Super League kicked off and ensured a

pyramid restructure, and in 2014 United were placed in the FA Premier Northern League One but found themselves relegated for only the second time.

Dan O'Hearne was installed as manager and a name change to Sheffield United Ladies happened in 2016, before Carla Ward joined the club from Sheffield FC as assistant manager at the end of 2017.

Under then General Manager Lee Walshaw, United made a commitment to bid for a licence to the new FA Women's Championship in time for the 2018-19 season and were awarded a place in the league shortly after Ward had taken over duties as first team manager.

A new squad was built but club legends such as Tania Marsden, who made her 300th appearance at the end of last season, were kept on and there was another name change to Sheffield United Women as the club moved into its most exciting new era yet.



1 ONE TO WATCH SIAN ROGERS

The experienced stopper became Sheffield United's first summer signing this season, and joins having spent time with Charlton Athletic. Rogers has also represented Arsenal and Aston Villa - helping her latter to the Barclays Women's Championship title in 2019/2020.

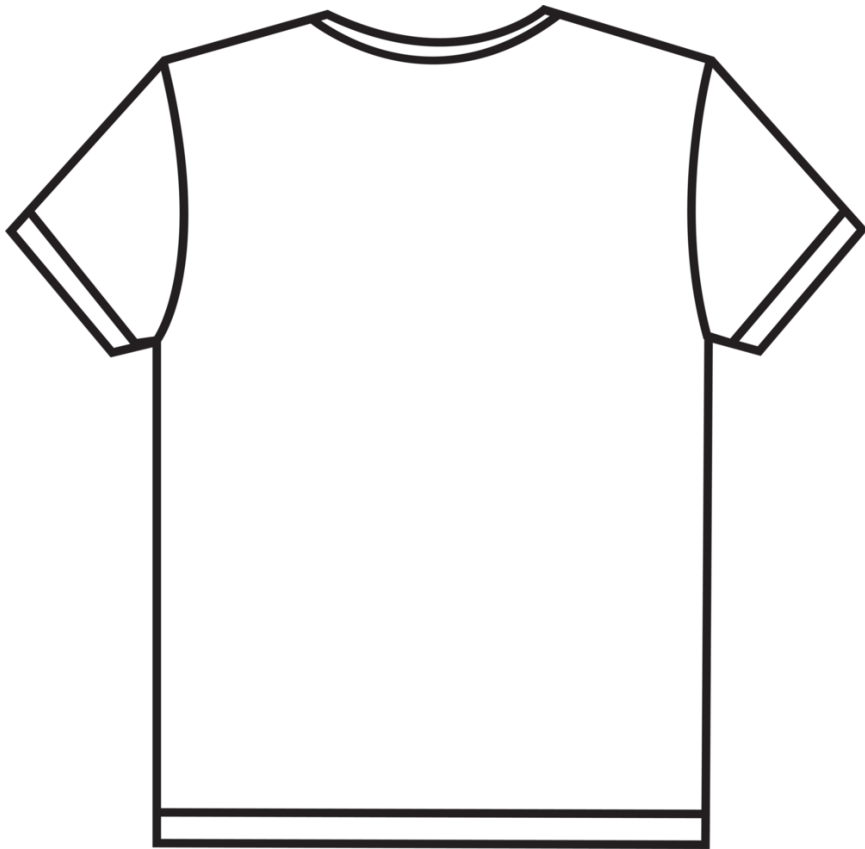
